PREVENTING TEEN AND YOUNG ADULT HOMELESSNESS IN ORANGE COUNTY

There are 27,000 teens and young adults who are homeless or housing insecure in Orange County.

On Tuesday, September 24th, Olive Crest broke ground on its latest project to prevent teen and young adult homelessness. These new 16 apartment homes with two bedrooms in each, will be located adjacent to the Children and Family Resource Center. Serving young adults, ages 18 to 25, the apartments are being built by RSI Dream Communities, as a gift from the Ronald M. Simon Family Foundation, with additional contributions from hundreds of other major donors. This is the first of five planned apartment communities for Olive Crest throughout Southern California and Nevada.

The new apartment homes are scheduled to open in winter 2025.



Ron Simon, Founder & Chairman RSI Dream Communities

Mr. Simon's expertise in the building industry spans decades. As CEO of Perma-Built, he oversaw the production of bath-related products like medicine and vanity cabinets. In 1989, he founded RSI Home Products, where he served as Chairman and CEO until 2011, leading the company to remarkable success. Under his leadership, RSI partnered with four private equity firms, generating substantial returns on investment.

In 2008, Simon established RSI Homes, later forming RSI Communities in 2015, which quickly grew to own or control over 11,000 home lots in California and Texas. Additionally, Simon founded DuCal Energy in 2015, later re-branded to RSI Energy, to provide solar energy solutions to the housing market.



Seth Putnam, a former Olive Crest teen, bravely shared his story and thoughts during the groundbreaking ceremony. He said, "I didn't have anywhere to go when I turned 18. Without [Olive Crest's] program, I pretty much would have been homeless. This is going to help a lot of people that are in my situation as well. You hit a certain age, and everybody just thinks that you're not trying hard enough, or it's all your fault that you're homeless. A lot of people like me just don't have anybody, and we need something just to get somewhere. Olive Crest gave us a home and prepared us for adulthood. Thank you Olive Crest donors and staff. Now, I work as a phlebotomist and am pursuing my nursing degree."
